- Fighting corruption through the increase of the transparency and accountability of state expenses. Review of international experience of public undertakings, models of management and strategies contributing to the reduction of corruption (Kevin R. Smith, an expert invited by GYLA);
- Undertakings owned by self-governing cities of Georgia issues of transparency and accountability (GYLA);
- Undertakings established with state participation (National Agency of State Property);
- Results of the audit of the efficiency of public undertakings challenges and recommendations (State Audit Service);
- Croatian anti-corruption programme for undertakings established with state participation (GYLA).
